The Journey by Francesca Sanna

Gist:

This powerfully illustrated, almost wordless book, is told from the perspective of a young child. War comes to her seaside home and takes her father. A mother and her two children set out on a perilous journey (no country). They leave home by car, truck, bicycle, foot, ferry and train.

Enduring Understandings:

- ♦ Perseverance can save the day.
- ♦ Luck can save the day.
- ♦ People are both good and bad.
- One can survive with one parent.
- War tears families apart.
- Refugees leave their homes because their lives are in danger.
- War causes refugees.
- Hope and fear of unknown can go together.
- Escape journeys are unpredictable and take many forms.

Activities:

- ♦ Show short animated documentaries: <u>www.amnesty.org/en/latest/education/2016/03/seven-free-short-films-about-refugees-recommended-by-human-rights-educators/</u>
- ◆ Teach lessons: Eight educational resources that explain the rights of refugees. https://www.amnesty.org/en/latest/education/2015/10/8-educational-resources-to-better-understand-the-refugee-crisis/

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- ◆ Teach lesson: Identity and Belonging. These activities encourage learners to think about why people migrate and how we can make refugees and migrants feel welcome. Discussion activities look at the impact of behavior, and a role-play activity promotes empathy and understanding.

- ◆ Teach lesson: Refugees and Identity. Help learners to explore identity, alienation and the value of friendship by following the real-life story of Ebrahim, told through a comic. The group discussion activities are used alongside cartoon panels from the comic book <u>Over Under Sideways Down</u>, with project ideas for young people to develop their work, in or outside of the classroom. https://www.redcross.org.uk/get-involved/teaching-resources/refugees-identity.
- ◆ Teach lesson: Refugees Welcome. The discussion ideas, drama activities, photos and a short film will build learners' empathy for the real people affected by the crisis. Young people will also be encouraged to consider the difference a welcome could make to someone seeking asylum and refuge.
